Bush's 2005 Inauguration Celebration: Brought to You by Corporate America

(Update II: January 18, 2005)

Lobbyists are joining corporate America in financing what is projected to be the most expensive inauguration in the nation's history. An analysis of the latest figures from the Presidential Inaugural Committee, as of January 18, reveals that registered lobbyists have contributed \$400,000 to President Bush's second inauguration. The lobbyists' contributions, combined with those from corporations and their senior executives, pushed big business's total contributions to the inaugural festivities to \$24 million, or 96 percent of the \$24.9 million raised so far. The average contribution to the fund is currently over \$128,000.

An analysis also shows that these same business interests are the ones that played a leading role in funding Bush's campaigns. Nearly half of the contributors to the inaugural are, or employ, elite Bush fundraisers known as "Rangers," "Pioneers" and "Super Rangers."

These fundraisers helped finance the president's two election bids by "bundling" together \$2,000 contributions (the legal limit) from their business associates and colleagues. These "bundlers" became Bush "Pioneers" or "Rangers" by raising at least \$100,000 or \$200,000, respectively, for Bush's presidential campaigns. Many also attained "Super Ranger" status by bundling at least \$300,000 for a Republican National Committee (RNC) fund that also was used for Bush's 2004 election bid. During the 2004 campaign, "bundling" afforded corporate America a way to circumvent the ban on direct corporate contributions ("soft money") to presidential campaigns. But those corporations are under no similar restrictions in attempting to curry favor from the administration by financing the president's inaugural events.

- **Of the 194 contributors to the inaugural fund, 97 percent (188 of 194) are corporations or their chairmen, CEOs, presidents, or owners. Those 188 contributors account for 96 percent (\$24 million) of the money raised by the committee as of January 18, 2005.** The bans on corporate contributions to presidential campaigns or the political parties of presidential candidates does not in any way extend to presidential inauguration celebrations. Corporations attempting to buy influence don't have to take a chance on backing an unsuccessful candidate when they can throw money at the celebration of a known winner. So far, the 127 corporate contributors account for \$17.2 million (69 percent) of the \$24.9 million raised by the inaugural committee. Additionally, all but six of the 67 individual contributors are senior executives or business owners. Those 61 industry chiefs account for \$6.8 million (27 percent) of the \$24.9 million raised by the inaugural committee.
- **Nearly half (89 of 194) of the inaugural contributors are Pioneers, Rangers or Super Rangers, or are employers of these elite Bush fundraisers.** Collectively, these fundraisers and their employers account for nearly half (\$12.3 million) of the \$24.9 million raised by the

inaugural committee. Members of this elite group have been seeking to curry favor with the administration since Bush's 2000 campaign, raising at least \$24.8 million for his two presidential campaigns and the RNC fund used for his campaigns.

- **Seven lobbyists and lobbying firms have contributed \$400,000 to the inaugural fund.** Pioneers, Rangers and Super Rangers from the lobbying industry bundled at least \$11 million for Bush's 2004 campaign. Those lobbyists include the firms of Barbour Griffith & Rogers (\$25,000), Blank Rome (\$200,000), Perennial Strategy Group (\$25,000), Piper Rudnick (\$25,000), Washington Group International (\$25,000), and Williams & Jensen (\$50,000). Blank Rome Chairman David Girard-diCarlo also \$50,000 contributed to the fund.
- **The finance and investment industry is the largest contributor to the inaugural fund. Forty-five corporations and executives have contributed \$6.3 million.** President Bush's first term delivered many items on the financial industry's wish list. His cuts in capital gains, estate, income and dividend taxes have been a boon to the securities industry. The president's next term could prove even more beneficial for the industry: brokerage houses and mutual funds stand to make a fortune on administering the sheltered funds in "personal savings accounts" and private Social Security accounts. Financial industry Pioneers, Rangers and Super Rangers bundled at least \$21.7 million for Bush's 2004 campaign.
- **The energy industry, from which 15 corporations and executives – including nine from the oil industry – contributed \$2.4 million, is the second largest contributor to the fund.** It is perhaps no surprise that the industry owing the Bush administration the most is one of the largest contributors to the inauguration. From his National Energy Policy to changes in the Clean Air Act, Bush has consistently sided with big oil, gas, and utility interests. The president recently vowed to push for comprehensive energy legislation that would affect virtually every segment of the industry. Pioneers, Rangers and Super Rangers from the energy industry bundled at least \$5.2 million for Bush's 2004 campaign.
- **Two corporations skirted the \$250,000 contribution cap (established by the inaugural committee) by making multiple payments through subsidiaries.**
 - **Ameriquest** and three of its subsidiaries, Argent Mortgage Co., Town and Country Credit and Long Beach Acceptance Corp., have contributed a total of \$1 million to Bush's inauguration. Chairman Ronald Arnall and his wife Dawn achieved Ranger and Super Ranger status in 2004 by bundling a combined total of at least \$500,000 for President Bush's re-election effort. The couple also contributed \$5 million to the Progress for America 527 group, which ran ads promoting Bush's re-election. Ameriquest, owned by the Arnalls, registered in 2004 to lobby on the Responsible Lending Act, a bill that would replace strong state laws protecting borrowers from predatory lenders with a weaker federal standard. Ameriquest would benefit greatly if the President supported its passage in 2005, because the firm is a sub-prime lender that specializes in loans to people with bad credit.
 - **Marriott International** and its subsidiaries Marriott Vacation Club and Ritz-Carlton Hotel Company contributed a total of \$750,000. A review of 2004 lobbying records shows that Marriott has been lobbying the White House on extending the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act (which shielded the company from paying higher insurance premiums after 9/11). The corporation also says it has lobbied the Treasury department on various tax matters.

The Presidential Inauguration Fund: A Brief History

President Clinton's first inaugural committee raised roughly \$42 million in 1993, which was raised from both corporate and private donors.¹ While there was no cap on contributions, only one contributor, Merrill Lynch, contributed \$250,000. Thirteen other donors, including both corporations and individuals, contributed \$100,000 apiece. The committee spent only \$33 million, however, and rolled its surplus over for the 1997 inauguration.

Clinton's second inauguration in 1997 cost \$29.6 million. His inaugural committee raised \$23.7 million, but since there was a \$9.9 million surplus from his 1993 inaugural, there ended up being a \$4 million surplus. Contributions to Clinton's second inauguration were voluntarily capped at \$100 by the committee.

George W. Bush's first inauguration cost nearly \$40 million, which was raised from corporations and individuals. There was a \$100,000 contribution cap that was self-imposed by the committee.

The Presidential Inauguration Fund: Fixes Needed for a Broken System

Federal election law exempts presidential inaugural fundraising from all campaign finance regulations, such as limits on individual contributions and a ban on corporate contributions, other than a requirement to disclose contributions of \$200 or more and a ban on contributions by foreign nationals. After the Bipartisan Campaign Finance Reform Act (BCRA, or, the "McCain-Feingold" bill), banned direct corporate contributions to the presidential campaign coffers administered by political parties, the inaugural fund became an attractive alternative for corporations hoping to curry presidential favor by writing large checks. Indeed, it is ironic that while federal election law recognizes the corrupting influence of checks from foreigners, it sees no such problems with checks from domestic interests with their own agendas.

The possibility for corruption exists any time a politician accepts a six-figure check from anyone. Congress should end the double standard for inaugural fundraising under federal election law. Presidential inaugurations – the celebration of an election victory – should be viewed as part and parcel of the process of selecting our president. As such, the contributions to inaugural ceremonies should be subject to the same restrictions and disclosure requirements applicable to federal campaigns.

¹ Note: Prior to 2002 there was no required official disclosure of inaugural fundraising to the Federal Election Commission, so these figures are based on numerous contemporary press accounts.
